

October, Month of the Holy Rosary: Daily Rosary for Peace

The Holy Father, Pope Leo XIV, has invited everyone to pray the Rosary for peace, every day of this month of October - personally, in the family, in the community.

<u>From Church teaching – The inspiration and truth of the Bible</u>

In last Sunday's Second Reading, we heard St Paul tell Timothy, 'All scripture is inspired by God and can profitably be used for teaching, for refuting error, for guiding people's lives and teaching them to be holy.

This is how the man who is dedicated to God becomes fully equipped and ready for any good work.' (2 Tim 3:16-17)

We follow this up by looking at some Church teachings on the inspiration and truth of Sacred Scripture.

'Holy Mother Church...holds that the books of both the Old and New Testaments in their entirety, with all their parts, are sacred and canonical because written under the inspiration of the Holy Spirit, they have God as their author and have been handed on as such to the Church herself (cf. First Vatican Council).'

'In composing the sacred books, God chose men and while employed by Him they made use of their powers and abilities, so that with Him acting in them and through them, they, as true authors, consigned to writing everything and only those things which He wanted.

'Therefore, since everything asserted by the inspired authors or sacred writers must be held to be asserted by the Holy Spirit, it follows that the books of Scripture must be acknowledged as teaching solidly, faithfully and without error that truth which God wanted put into sacred writings for the sake of salvation (cf. St Augustine, De Genesi ad Litteram; St Thomas Aquinas, On Truth; Council of Trent DS 783; Pope Leo XIII, Providentissimus Deus (1893)).'

Vatican II, Dogmatic Constitution on Divine Revelation *Dei Verbum*, 11 (1965)

'The sacred writers, or to speak more accurately, the Holy Ghost "Who spoke by them, did not intend to teach men these things [scientific truths], things in no way profitable unto salvation" (St Augustine, *De Genesi ad Litteram*, AD 415). Hence they did not seek to penetrate the secrets of nature, but rather described and dealt with things in more or less figurative language.'

Pope Leo XIII, Encyclical Letter *Providentissimus Deus*

'It is absolutely wrong and forbidden, either to narrow inspiration to certain parts only of Holy Scripture, or to admit that the sacred writer has erred... For all the books which the Church receives as sacred and canonical,

are written wholly and entirely, with all their parts, at the dictation of the Holy Ghost; and so far is it from being possible that any error can co-exist with inspiration, that inspiration not only is essentially incompatible with error, but excludes and rejects it as absolutely and necessarily as it is impossible that God Himself, the supreme Truth, can utter that which is not true. This is the ancient and unchanging faith of the Church.'

Pope Leo XIII, Encyclical Letter Providentissimus Deus

'Since God speaks in Sacred Scripture through men in human fashion, the interpreter of Sacred Scripture, in order to see clearly what God wanted to communicate to us, should carefully investigate what meaning the sacred writers really intended, and what God wanted to manifest by means of their words.

'To search out the intention of the sacred writers, attention should be given, among other things, to "literary forms." For truth is set forth and expressed differently in texts which are variously historical, prophetic, poetic, or of other forms of discourse. The interpreter must investigate what meaning the sacred writer intended to express and actually expressed in particular circumstances by using contemporary literary forms in accordance with the situation of his own time and culture (St Augustine, On Christian Doctrine).

'For the correct understanding of what the sacred author wanted to assert, due attention must be paid to the customary and characteristic styles of feeling, speaking and narrating which prevailed at the time of the sacred writer, and to the patterns men normally employed at that period in their everyday dealings with one another (Pope Pius XII, Divino Afflante Spiritu (1943)).'


