From Church teaching: Relics of the Saints

The sacred bodies of the holy martyrs and of the other saints living with Christ, which have been living members of Christ and the temple of the Holy Spirit and which are destined to be raised and glorified by him unto life eternal, should also be venerated by the faithful. Through them many benefits are granted to men by God. For this reason, those who say that veneration and honour are not due to the relics of the saints or that these relics and other sacred memorials are honoured in vain by the faithful...are to be condemned absolutely, just as the Church has already condemned them and even now condemns them...

'The holy council earnestly desires to root out utterly any abuses that may have crept into these holy and saving practices, so that no representations of false doctrine should be set up that give occasion of dangerous error... All superstition must be removed from invocation of the saints, veneration of relics, and use of sacred images; all aiming at base profit must be eliminated... Nor are any new miracles to be accepted or new relics recognised without the bishop similarly examining and approving them.'

Council of Trent, Decree on the Invocation, Veneration, and Relics of the Saints and on Sacred Images (1563)

'The saints have been traditionally honoured in the Church and their authentic relics and images held in veneration. For the feasts of the saints proclaim the wonderful works of Christ in His servants, and display to the faithful fitting examples for their imitation.'

Vatican II, Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy Sacrosanctum Concilium 111 (1963)

'Relics in the Church have always received particular veneration and attention because the body of the Blesseds and of the Saints, destined for the resurrection, has been on earth the living temple of the Holy Spirit and the instrument of their holiness, recognised by the Apostolic See through beatification and canonisation. The relics of the Blesseds and of the Saints may not be displayed for the veneration of the faithful without a proper certificate of the ecclesiastical authority who guarantees their authenticity... They are preserved and honoured with a religious spirit, avoiding every type of superstition and illicit trade.'

Holy See: Congregation for the Causes of Saints, Instruction Relics in the Church: Authenticity and Preservation (2017)

Why Relics?

Our veneration of relics is linked to the central Christian teaching of INCARNATION [from Latin: 'caro' = 'flesh']: 'The Word became flesh and dwelt among us.' (Jn 1:14) God, the eternal Word of the Father, took human flesh as Jesus.

The *spiritual* is of course central to religion, but Christianity, and Catholicism especially, does not disdain the *material*, the *physical*. God created matter as 'very good', (*Gen* 1:31) and the body is essential to human nature in particular. When God the Son became man, he took to himself true human flesh, and sanctified it. His body truly rose to new

life at Easter; and at his Second Coming, all our bodies will rise again, to reunite forever with our souls.

Our veneration given to the relics of the Saints is in view of this, and is directed ultimately to the saint whose relic it is. (Like any material aspect of religion, a relic *could* be used superstitiously if *cut off* from spiritual meaning - used as if a 'magical' object with no reference to God or his Saints.)

And obviously, our honour given to the Saints themselves differs essentially from the supreme honour of adoration and worship that may be given to God alone.

In Scripture we see God encouraging and endorsing our use of things physically connected with the holy, by working miracles in association with them.

Thus the corpse of a man is touched to the bones of the prophet Elisha and the man returns to life (2 Kings 13:20-21); the woman with a haemorrhage is cured by touching the hem of Jesus' cloak (Mt 9:20-22); and people are healed and evil spirits driven out when handkerchiefs from the apostle Paul are placed on them (Acts 19:11-12).
