Jesus in our gospel warns of the fate of the rich man who neglected the poor man, Lazarus, starving at his gate:

'The poor man died and was carried away by the angels to the bosom of Abraham. The rich man also died and was buried. In his torment in Hades he looked up and saw Abraham a long way off with Lazarus in his bosom. So he cried out, "Father Abraham, pity me and send Lazarus to dip the tip of his finger in water and cool my tongue, for I am in agony in these flames."

"My son," Abraham replied "remember that during your life good things came your way, just as bad things came the way of Lazarus. Now he is being comforted here while you are in agony. But that is not all: between us and you a great gulf has been fixed, to stop anyone, if he wanted to, crossing from our side to yours, and to stop any crossing from your side to ours." (Luke 16:22-26)

The imagery of 'flames' Jesus uses here is typical of his way of speaking about hell - echoing his expression in his account of the Last Judgement: 'the eternal fire prepared for the devil and his angels'. (*Matt* 25:41) Mark's Gospel quotes him using similar imagery: 'their worm does not die and the fire is not quenched.' (*Mk* 9:48) Is this physical fire as we know it, or is Our Lord pointing toward some reality not fully expressible within the limits of earthly language and experience? We cannot say for sure.

Vatican II, repeating Jesus' teaching on hell and reaffirming the Catholic Faith of the ages, uses his same language of 'eternal fire', and also 'outer darkness':

'We strive therefore to please God in all things and we put on the armour of God, that we may be able to stand against the wiles of the devil and resist in the evil day. (Cf. *Eph* 6:11-13) Since however we know neither the day nor the hour, we should follow the advice of the Lord and watch constantly so that, when the single course of our earthly life is completed, (Cf. *Heb* 9:27) we may merit to enter with him into the marriage feast and be numbered among the blessed, (Cf. *Mt* 25:31-46) and not, like the wicked and slothful servants, (Cf. *Mt* 25:26) be ordered to depart into the eternal fire, (Cf. *Mt* 25:41) into the outer darkness where "men will weep and gnash their teeth." (*Mt* 22:13; 25:30)' (Vatican II, Dogmatic Constitution on the Church *Lumen Gentium*, Ch. 7 'The Pilgrim Church', 48)

At the end of our gospel, the rich man begs Abraham to send Lazarus to his brothers to warn them: "If someone comes to them from the dead, they will repent." But Abraham replies, "If they will not listen either to Moses or to the prophets, they will not be convinced even if someone should rise from the dead." (Luke 16:30, 31)

Jesus is pointing here to his own Resurrection, indicating that even in the face of that, there would still be people who refuse to believe and to repent. These are in particular danger of damnation, he is lovingly pleading.

Even those who think of themselves as his followers can be in denial - not only disbelieving in hell, but (quite unmoored from what is actually in the gospels) deluding themselves that Jesus taught no such thing, only 'love'.

In truth, his teaching on hell goes hand-in-hand with his teaching on love. God gave us free will, and fully respects that freedom. Hell is the natural result if, to the end, we freely *refuse* to love God above all things and our neighbour made in his image. Heaven is union with God, and it is impossible to unite with the God whom we reject.

Catechism of the Catholic Church

We cannot be united with God unless we freely choose to love him. But we cannot love God if we sin gravely against him, against our neighbour or against ourselves... To die in mortal sin without repenting and accepting God's merciful love means remaining separated from him for ever by our own free choice. This state of definitive self-exclusion from communion with God and the blessed is called 'hell.'

1034 Jesus often speaks of 'Gehenna' of 'the unquenchable fire' reserved for those who to the end of their lives refuse to believe and be converted, where both soul and body can be lost. (Cf. Mt 5:22, 29; 10:28; 13:42, 50; Mk 9:43-48) Jesus solemnly proclaims that he 'will send his angels, and they will gather...all evil doers, and throw them into the furnace of fire,' (Mt 13:41-42) and that he will pronounce the condemnation: 'Depart from me, you cursed, into the eternal fire!' (Mt 25:41)

1035 The teaching of the Church affirms the existence of hell and its eternity. Immediately after death the souls of those who die in a state of mortal sin descend into hell,

where they suffer the punishments of hell, 'eternal fire.' (Cf. DS 76; 409; 411; 801; 858; 1002; 1351; 1575; Pope St Paul VI, Credo of the People of God 12) The chief punishment of hell is eternal separation from God, in whom alone man can possess the life and happiness for which he was created and for which he longs.

The affirmations of Sacred Scripture and the 1036 teachings of the Church on the subject of hell are a call to the responsibility incumbent upon man to make use of his freedom in view of his eternal destiny. They are at the same time an urgent call to conversion: 'Enter by the narrow gate; for the gate is wide and the way is easy, that leads to destruction, and those who enter by it are many. For the gate is narrow and the way is hard, that leads to life, and those who find it are few.' (Mt 7:13-14)...

God predestines no one to go to hell; for this, a 1037 wilful turning away from God (a mortal sin) is necessary, and persistence in it until the end. In the Eucharistic liturgy and in the daily prayers of her faithful, the Church implores the mercy of God, who does not want 'any to perish, but all to come to repentance'. (2 Pet 3:9)
